

He spoke of the high regard in which Shri Dharmadhikari was held in all areas of his work—his punctuality, meticulous coordination,

and spirit of cooperation—qualities that consistently inspired those around him. Shri Bharadwaj also conveyed the sentiments of the higher authorities of CBSE, who recognised him as an exemplary officer, a trusted colleague, and a true asset to the institution, adding that their support and goodwill will always remain with his beloved family.

He reminded everyone of the importance of being mindful of their health, emphasising that well-being is the foundation for all that we do. He urged the gathering to take proactive steps to care for themselves and not to neglect regular check-ups and healthy habits. Health, he said, should always remain the first priority, for only then can we serve others effectively.

Mahesh D. Dharmadhikari was a pioneer in establishing the CBSE Regional Centre in Trivandrum. Dr. Indira Rajan first met him in 2013, when, on the directions of then CBSE Chairman Shri Vineet Joshi, he came to Kerala to set up the Regional Centre. Their discussions in Ernakulam laid the foundation for the centre, where he served as the first Regional Officer.

News of his untimely demise reached Dr. Indira while she was attending the CCSK "Snehapoorvam" scholarship programme for 42 students from the landslide-affected region of Wayanad on $2^{\rm nd}$ Aug-2025 at cochin —a moment that turned a day of hope into one of deep loss.



His legacy as an educationalist, artist, and humanitarian will continue to inspire, and his memory will remain deeply cherished by all who knew him.



Shri Jai Prakash Chaturvedi, Director, CBSE Affiliation, fondly remembered – Late Dharmadhikari as a leader who combined exceptional administrative acumen with rare human warmth. He spoke of how Late Dharmadhikari could balance rules with compassion, creating a culture where colleagues felt valued, trusted, and inspired to give their best. Beyond his professional excellence, he was a deeply compassionate human being, sensitive to the needs of others and always willing to extend a helping hand, leaving a lasting impression on everyone who had the privilege of working with him. His humility, even in moments of great achievement, reflected the grace of a

true leader. He never sought recognition for himself, but found joy in the success of others. To those who knew him, his guidance was not just professional—it was a source of moral strength and personal encouragement.

Shri Sachin Thakur, Joint Secretary, Affiliation, and Former Regional Officer, CBSE Trivandrum,

fondly recalled his close professional association with Late Dharmadhikari, even though they had not worked together in Kerala. He spoke of their strong connection over the years and how Late Dharmadhikari approached difficult decisions with calm dignity, always keeping the welfare of students at the forefront. He described him as a leader who carried responsibility with grace and executed every task with dedication.





Shri Rajib Bharuah, Regional Officer, CBSE Trivandrum, who succeeded Late Dharmadhikari when he was transferred to Chennai, shared his heartfelt admiration for the late officer's remarkable contributions to the region. Shri Bharuah spoke warmly of their professional rapport and his own association with me during that time. He reflected on the enduring relevance of the systems and values instituted under Late Dharmadhikari's leadership, noting that the region's continued excellence is a living testament to his vision.

In his address, he conveyed, on behalf of the entire CBSE Regional Office, and the CBSE fraternity in Trivandrum Region for their deepest condolences to the bereaved family, and appreciated Dr. Indira Rajan, Secretary General, and Mrs. Suchitra Shyjinth, General Secretary, along with the CCSK team for thoughtfully organising the condolence meeting.


